



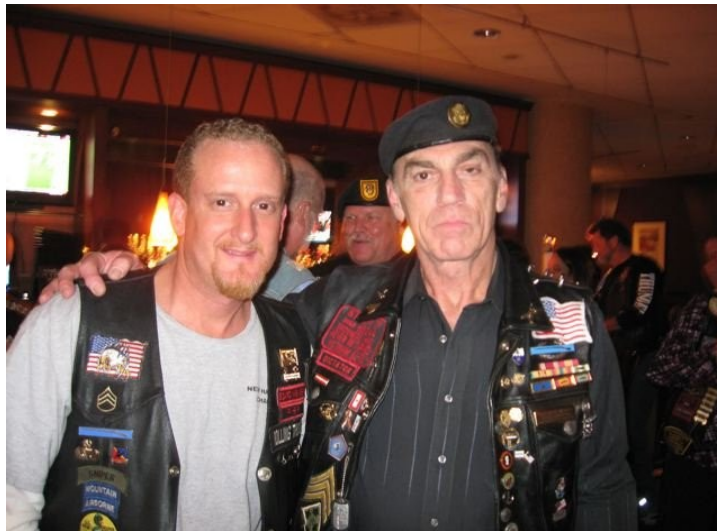

We hope everyone is well and looking forward to Rolling Thunder XXV on May 27,2012 in Washington, D.C.

We thank all of you for your continued support each year for our Prisoners of War/Missing in Action, Veterans and Troops. It's hard to believe its been 25 years since we started this demonstration; we are all much older than when we started but we hung in there and changed the POW/MIA issue from a lost cause to bring-

ing home remains and providing closure to many families.

Since Rolling Thunder started our government has recovered the following numbers of remains: WWI-6,WWII-240, Korean War-73, Vietnam War-697, Gulf War-14 and Iraq War-3 with 7 live paws returned from this war. No live American paws have come home from past wars. Why not?

To our knowledge no one in Washington has asked any foreign country about live Americans captured from all past wars. In almost 100 years no one cared enough to find remains from WWI until now. What is our government doing to find SSgt. Ahmed Al-Taie captured in Iraq and Sgt. Bowe R. Bergdahl captured in Afghanistan? We are pulling out of Iraq and leaving SSgt. Al-Taie behind.

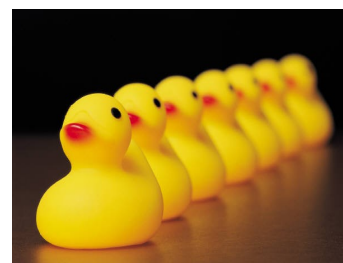
PLUCK A DUCK—GREAT FUNDRAISER AT THE 2011 NAULTS THUNDER RUN

THE NATIONAL LEAGUE OF POW/MIA FAMILIES UPDATE DECEMBER 20, 2011

AMERICANS IDENTIFIED:

There are now still **1,678** Americans listed by the Defense POW/Missing Personnel Office (DPMO) as missing and unaccounted-for from the Vietnam War. On November 15th, DPMO added one name to the list of accounted-for US personnel: **First Lieutenant Robert E. Bennett, III, USAF**, from New Jersey. 1LT Bennett was listed as KIA/BNR in South Vietnam on December 13, 1967. His remains were recovered April 13, 2010 and

identified November 15, 2011. **The number of Americans returned and identified since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 is now 905;** another 63 US personnel, recovered post-incident and identified before the end of the war, bring the total to 968. Of the 1,678 unreturned American veterans from the Vietnam War, our POW/MIAs, **90% were lost in Vietnam or in areas of Laos and**

Cambodia under Vietnam's wartime control: Vietnam-1,287 (VN-472, VS-815); Laos-326; Cambodia-58; Peoples Republic of China territorial waters-7; over 450 were over-water losses.





POW/MIA FEDERAL LAW FLAG REQUIREMENTS

Federal law requires the POW/MIA flag to be flown on the following days:

- Armed Forces Day, May 16
- Memorial Day, May 25
- Flag Day, June 14
- Independence Day, July 4
- POW/MIA Day, 3rd Friday of September
- Veterans Day, Nov. 11

WEEKLY POW/MIA VIGIL - MEREDITH NH

Every Thursday evening starting at 7:00 p.m. people gather in Hesky Park, located in Meredith, New Hampshire. The Thursday evening Vigils started in August of 1989 in an effort to raise awareness about the abandonment of Prisoners of War and those Missing in Action. The first Vigil lasted 15 minutes; one minute to symbolize each year since the US State Department declared, "There are no more prisoners in Southeast Asia. They are all dead." The vigil now spans 32 minutes.

The Meredith POW/MIA Vigil is believed to be the longest consecutively-held vigil in the United States. There has never been a Thursday night Vigil unattended since its inception. Vigil goers have weathered rain, sleet, snow, hail, thunder, lightning, and even temperatures of -37 degrees Fahrenheit.
